1. Problem

The Oregon Invasive Species Council (OISC) is established within the ODA and its membership, serving in an official ~~in their~~ capacity on the Council, are not currently insured for liability arising out of their actions taken for the Council within the course and scope of their appointment. The lack of liability insurance coverage exposes current Council members to personal liability for their actions and the risk of such personal liability can be expected to deter others from serving on the Council as members.

2. Solution

OISC to obtain insurance coverage for its voting members (not including nonvoting members employed by federal agencies) through Oregon's DAS Risk Management policy. With such coverage, the council can seek to sustain its members, undeterred by the current absence of any provision for liability insurance for voting Council members.

3. Proposed Changes to Statute

The OISC proposes adding the following language (similar to that found in ORS 561.400(4)):

In addition to or in lieu of the coverage provided pursuant to ORS 30.282 (Local public body insurance) (4), the Oregon Department of Administrative Services may provide to the Oregon Invasive Species Council and its appointed voting members, including officers, employees and agents acting within the scope of their employment or duties, protection against liability as part of the insurance provided to the State Department of Agriculture pursuant to ORS 278.120 (Claims management) to 278.215 (Uninsured motorist coverage requirements). The Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall determine any additional contributions to be apportioned to the State Department of Agriculture under ORS 278.110 for extending insurance to the Oregon Invasive Species Council, and the State Department of Agriculture shall pay the assessments from such moneys as may be available therefor.

Note: OISC is awaiting confirmation from DAS as to which particular statute would get amended. i.e.- One of the statutes that establishes the Council and its functions/membership/duties or another statute that addresses who is/isn't covered by DAS insurance and to what extent.

5. Equity Analysis

The only racial or ethnic minority group identified as potentially serving on the Council are tribal members representing their separate sovereign interests in invasive species protection. Because tribal members are classified as voting members in ORS 577.770(1)(b), they would be provided liability insurance coverage under this LC concept, the absence of which might serve as a deterrent for tribal members seeking a Council appointment as a voting Council member.

- Morgan Gratz-Weiser joined the Governor’s Office in November and will be covering the Department of Agriculture and the invasive species council. She recently worked at Oregon Environmental Council and as staff in the state senate prior.
- Katie Murray is the executive director for the Oregonians for Food & Shelter. She started in 2020 and previously was at Oregon State University.

UPDATE: Legislative Concept-Insurance

Chris Benemann

- LC has been submitted through appropriate channels and is in progress. Would provide coverage for current Council members under state risk policy and facilitates expanded membership to include parties who may be reluctant to participate due to lack of coverage.
- Christine inquired about expedited process- Chris unsure of mechanism

- Karen suggested waivers in the interim- Chris agreed it is good idea.
- Patrick to consult with ODA, Leg. Committee to draft
- Request for state partners to submit any existing waiver forms for adaptation.
- Noel inquired about an legislative concept/policy option package re: emergency account replenishment. Consensus to revisit in 2023.

Western IPM Grant

- Funded in full with 10 other projects.
- Agreements with grantor and collaborators in progress.
- Jalene Littlejohn provided overview of OISC Info Hub tool/interface
 - Sam highlighted utility for local/regional policymakers to get acquainted with relevant concerns as well as for statewide action/prioritization.
 - Karen inquired about trainings/orientation for submitting new species/info to the hub
 - Alex Stauch informed that Hub Working Group is planning trainings/workshops for contributors and taxa experts. Possibly looking at fillable form for submissions.

Budget Update

Troy Abercrombie provided updated budget figures, courtesy of the Department of Agriculture

Roundtable

- Wyatt Williams (ODF): Oregon Forest Pest Detector program revisions with Karen Ripley. Training in Southern Oregon in May for Mediterranean Oak Borer. Several individuals have been trapped...causes damage to liveoak. Creating training module. Working with ODA on delimiting trapping in Marion County. Received a grant from USFS to collect seed for genetic conservation of Oregon ash. Teamed up with Penn State research faculty.
- Karen Ripley (USFS): expanded on Wyatt's update- supporting testing at UC-Davis to see if Oregon white oak is susceptible to fungus that borer's carry. Med. Oak borer in primer, updates possible for Info Hub. Entomological Society of America approved new common name for *Lymantria dispar* (formerly gypsy moth). Similar efforts via Washington Council to rename "Asian" giant hornet. Communications committee working on 2021 annual report.
- Sam Chan (OR Sea Grant): Working on expanded review of common name revisions that better serve public/professionals with species ID, threat understanding, etc. No consistent pattern/formula for species names re: ethnic designations being used vs. not being used....Possible didymo detection...Willamette NF undertaking extensive monitoring project to determine extent/severity of didymo in watersheds.

Revising Oregon's State Plan for Aquatic Nuisance Species

Robyn Draheim provided an update on current progress on Oregon ANS Plan revisions. Project is in early stages but includes expanded stakeholder engagement, recruiting for advisory committees from different taxa groups/agencies, working toward "5-year goals" framework.

Presentation ([YouTube @ 1:33:35](#)): Green Crab Expansion, Toxin Monitoring & Outreach Messaging (Sylvia Yamada & Steve Rumrill) Provided species overview, history of introduction/expansion, long-term monitoring & recruitment statistics, management strategies/progress. Risk assessment required for 2022-2035. Oregon is behind on management planning/action relative to Washington. Q&A followed.

- Rick suggested that "Cat's group" that works on Division 56 rules could possibly take on the risk assessment.
