Invasive Green Crabs in the News:

Green Crabs (*Carcinus maenas*) are aggressive predators with the potential to significantly alter any ecosystem they invade. The green crab could outcompete species like Dungeness crab and consume large quantities of oysters and clams, threatening coastal economies in the Pacific Northwest and British Columbia.
